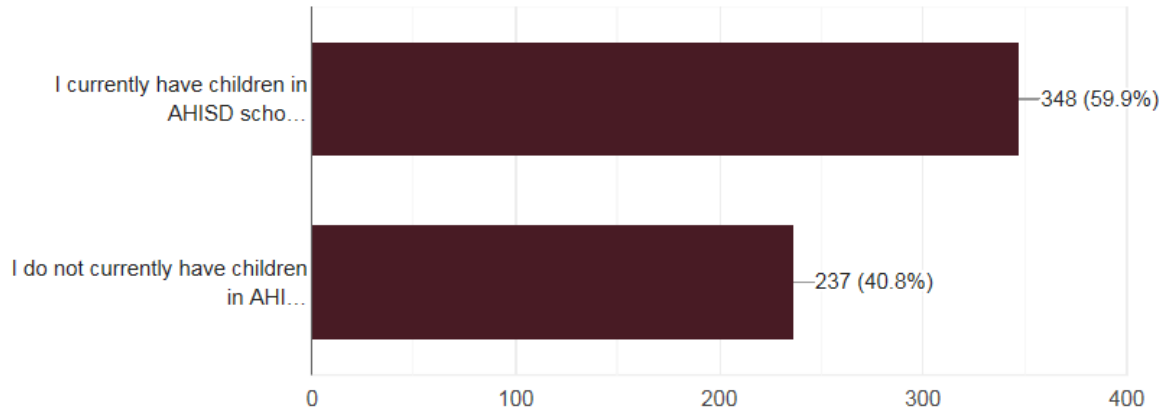

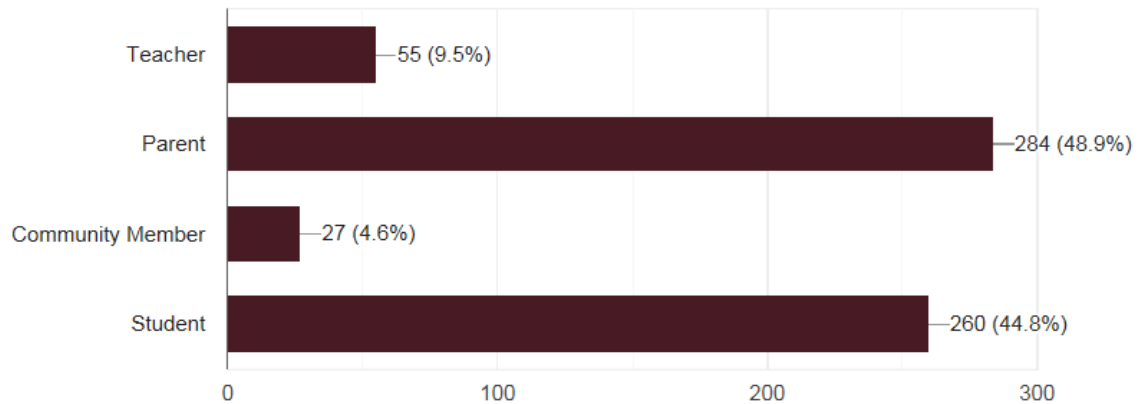

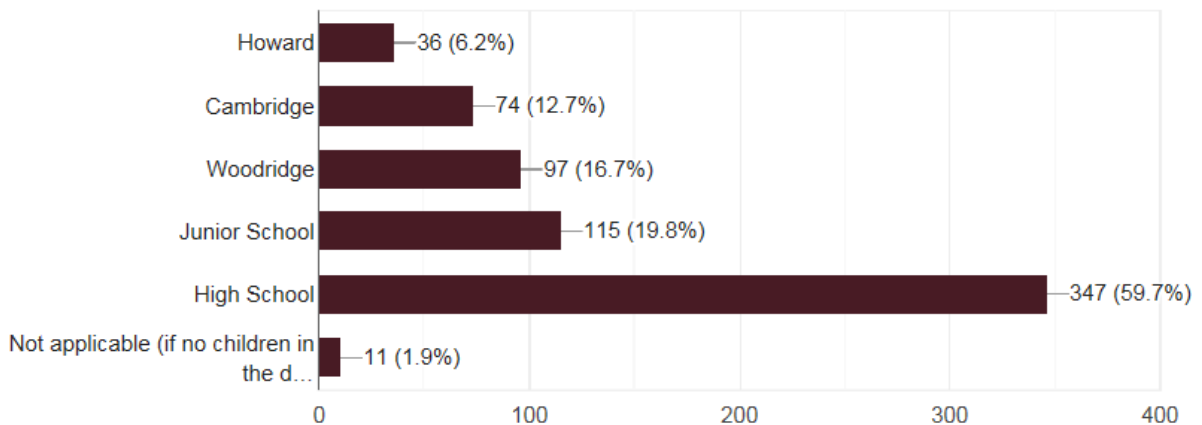

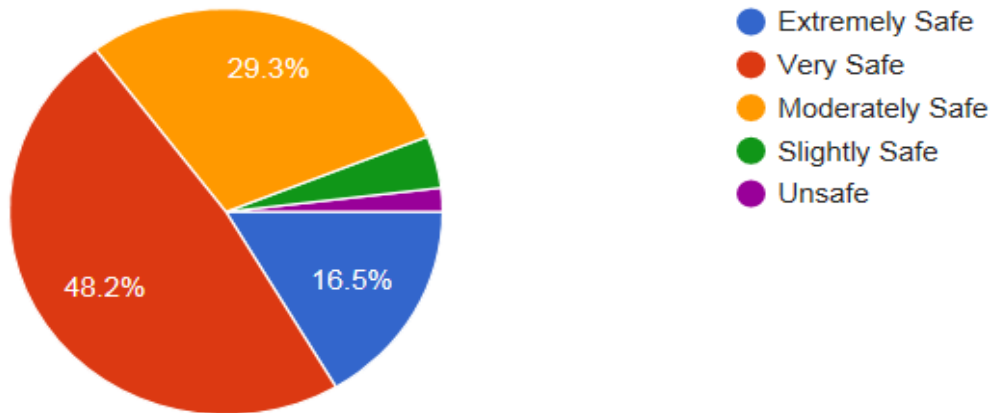
Identify Campus:

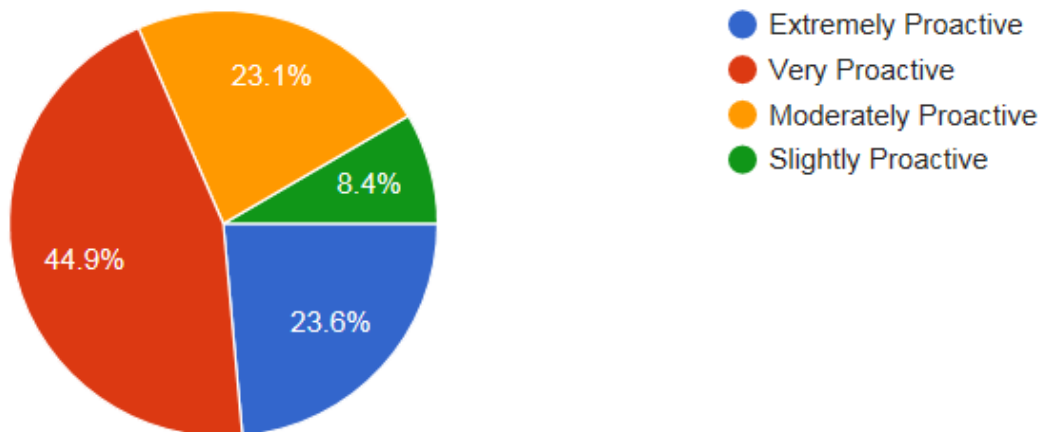
From your perspective, how safe are our students in AHISD schools?

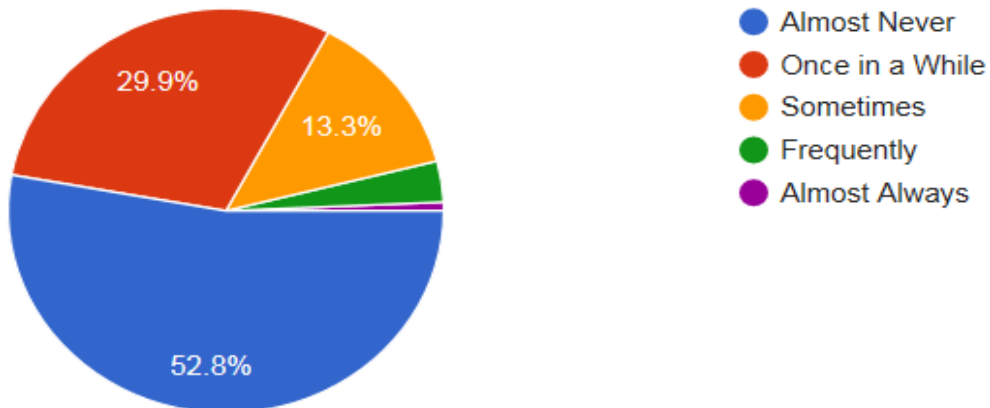
From your perspective, how proactive is AHISD in securing campuses?

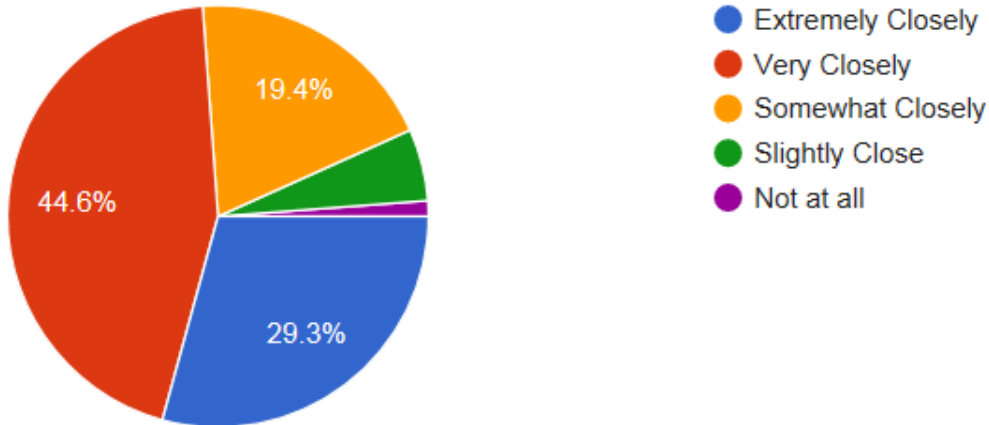
From your perspective, how often are there safety disturbances (fights, lockdowns, etc.) in school?

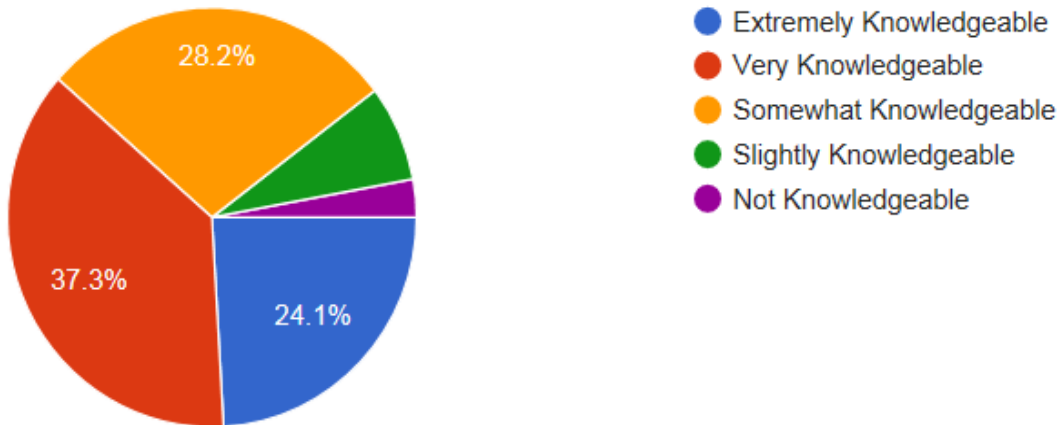
From your perspective, how closely does AHISD work with the local police departments?

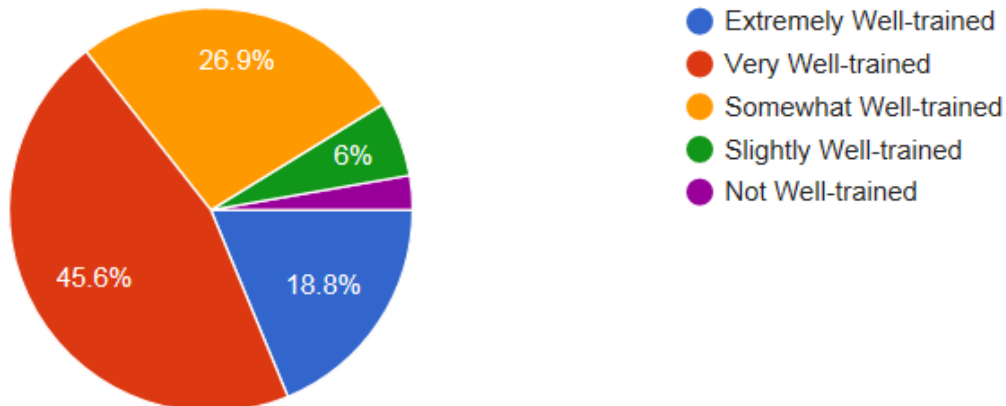
From your perspective, how knowledgeable is your child about school safety overall?

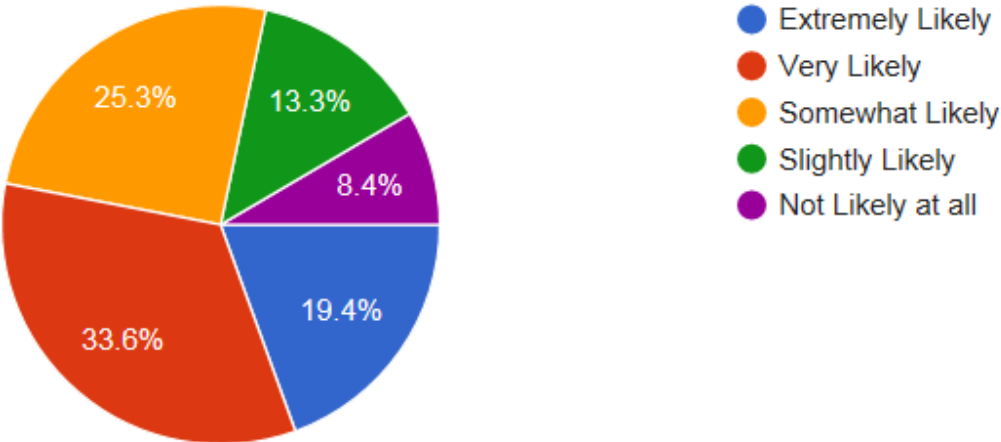
From your perspective, how well trained are teachers and staff on school safety?

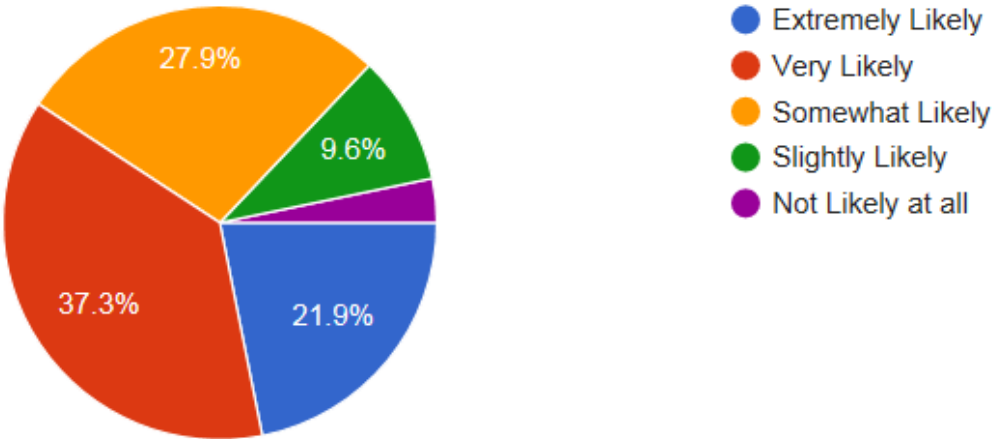
How likely is it that your child (if ever in crisis) would seek help from school resources/personnel (counselor, nurse, wellness counselor, faculty or administration)?

How likely is your child to report safety concerns regarding other students?

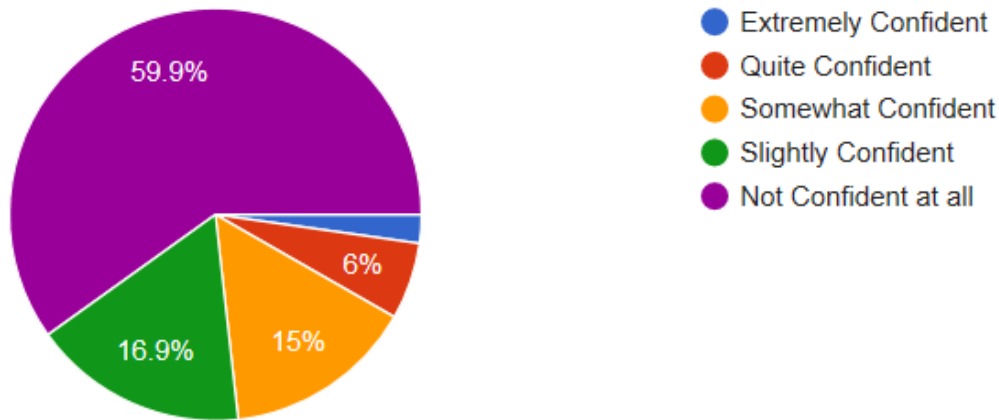

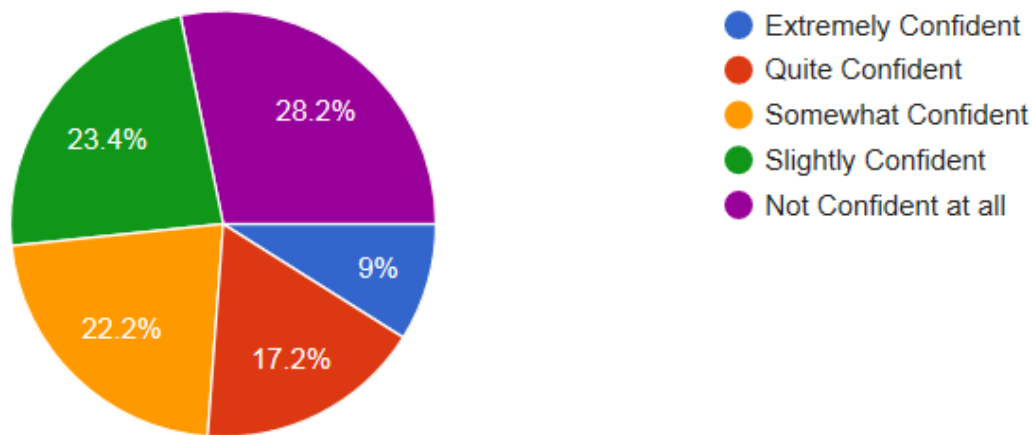
How confident are you that clear backpacks deter school shootings?
